# General Catheter Care Advice/Notes

- *Is the catheter necessary?*
- Would ISC be appropriate?
- Can a catheter valve be used?
- Reminder about the importance of hand hygiene before and after care wear gloves/apron when dealing with any aspect of catheter care (Health Protection Scotland Hand Hygiene)
- Reminder about the closed drainage bag system, legbag in situ for 5-7days, using a single use night bag, is it correctly attached with no kinks in tubing
- Reminder about importance of inserting catheter using an aseptic technique and following NHS Grampian Catheter Care Guidelines
- Has a lubricant been used when inserting a catheter has there been any allergies
- Urine should be collected in a disposable receptacle or separate jug for individual patient wash and dry between use
- Continence products should not be worn unless there is faecal soiling and then a bowel assessment should be undertaken, may interfere with drainage of leg drainage system
