A team approach to referrals

- Thank you for providing $1^{\mbox{\scriptsize st}}$ aid
- What next?
- Patient's suitable for referral
- High anxiety
- Open apex
- Very wide canals
- resorption



What can you do prior to referral?

- No emergency care at ADH/PDS
- At review appointment extirpate pulp and spin CaOH up the canal
- Take PA using size 0 film




Is it an open apex?

Is it an open apex?

- What do the guidelines say?
- Review clinically and radiographically in 4/52, 3/12, 6/12, 12 then annually
- Why?
- Checking for resorption and ankylosis

- Be brave and make the right decision








Dental Nurses/ Reception

What do you need to tell the dentist? What guidelines can you refer to?




Dentists /Therapists
