



## Impacts of Vaping



74% of schools report that vaping is not currently impacting their school, with 32% of Kincardine & Mearns schools reporting that vaping is impacting their school. 37.5% of schools in SIMD 1 (most deprived quintile) and 37.5% of SIMD 5 schools (least deprived quintile) report that vaping is currently impacting their schools.







Are these impacts positive or negative?





33% of schools report that vaping is having a negative impact on their school, with 40% of Marr schools reporting that vaping is negatively impacting their school. 13% of schools in Garioch (3) reported vaping as having a positive impact on their school. 50% of schools in SIMD 1 (most deprived quintile) and 40% of SIMD 3 schools report that vaping is currently having a negative impact on their schools.

Are you aware whether any pupils are using vapes to quit smoking?





## Impacts of Vaping

## Positive impacts

4 schools reported positive impacts, however schools noted that children were aware and it allowed the school to bring up the subject of vaping to discuss with pupils.





Negative impacts have been grouped, with schools noting that vape litter in playground was the most common negative impact (17 schools reported this), in some cases janitors picking up in high numbers. P6 and P7 pupils appear to have been seen or influenced to vape, with younger pupils picking up vapes and using them. A number of parents are reported to be vaping during pick-up time or when children are playing.


A number of schools reported that children seemed "fascinated and intrigued" and were "attracted by the bright colours and size", of vapes, noting that children "believe vaping is aimed at children due to the flavours e.g. bubblegum"


